<u>Objective</u>

To promote good governance and ensure an effective and well-functioning democracy at all levels.

Report

The current methodology of determining the numbers, by Political group etc, on each of the Committees and Sub Committees, is based upon their total number of representatives over the 16 members of the Council, e.g. if a Political group had 12 representatives, then they would have 75% of the places available on the main committees. This does not mean necessarily having 75% on each committee, they may choose to have more membership on one committee than the others. Current practice is, as best as can be done, to have equal representation on each committee.

At the beginning of this current Council, for the main 3 committees, 13 members on each, there were 39 seats to fill. The split within the Council, at the time of the 2025 election, was 9 Reform UK, 4 Conservatives and 3 Labour. This resulted in 22, 10 and 7, places respectively, on the main committees. See Appendix 1 below for details of all Main and Sub Committees for reference following the May election.

As a by election has been called in the Bebside and Kitty Brewster ward, due to the resignation of one of the two Councillors, this may result in a different split for the main committee seats available, as shown below:
